Source Separation

Compostable Organics

Organics must be removed from any packaging. If the packaging is recyclable, it should be cleaned and put in either a blue bag or a dumpster that is designated for recyclable materials. Cardboard must be bundled or put in a separate container.

Recyclables

All recyclable materials need to be separated into paper or containers and put in blue bags. If using dumpsters, a dumpster for each type of recycling will be required i.e. one for paper and one for containers. Recycling cannot be mixed together.

Garbage

Garbage must be disposed of in clear bags. Mixed waste cannot be put in dumpsters or a penalty fee will be applied.

Inspection & Enforcement

All loads entering the Waste Resource Management Centre are subject to inspection and enforcement by the General Manager or designate. The General Manager or designate may issue warnings, charge increased tipping fees, impose administrative fees or revoke privileges of site users for non-compliance with our Bylaws or any issued directive.

Valley Waste

Valley Waste is one of seven solid waste regions in the Province that were formed to work toward waste diversion and prevention on a regional basis allowing for economies of scale and increased financial viability of recycling and composting in Nova Scotia.

The Valley Region Solid Waste-Resource Management Authority is a body corporate formed under an Inter-Municipal Services Agreement encompassing the Municipality of the County of Kings, and the Towns of Annapolis Royal, Berwick, Kentville, Middleton and Wolfville.

When Disasters Happen

When disasters happen, Valley Waste is here to help with disposal of damaged items and goods. Our Education Team can advise on the best course of action to comply with our Solid Waste Resource By-Law to avoid financial penalties.

Materials Banned from Disposal

Section 4.4 Solid Waste Resource By-law names two classes of materials that are banned from disposal in landfill: 1.1 materials banned by Provincial Regulation; and 1.2 materials banned by the Authority. Banned items are classified as Recyclables, Compostable Organics, Household Hazardous Waste, Hazardous Waste, and includes cardboard, tires, and electronics. Disposal bans are in effect at Authority facilities for the materials listed under Schedule "A" DIRECTIVES - Section 1 – Banned Materials.

Flow Control

All materials must be source separated, and no waste can be removed from the Valley Waste region without permission from the General Manager or designate.
