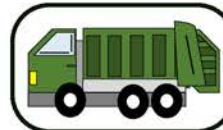

## CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

Please contact your Town Office for confirmation on collection

**Management Centres** - Drop your tree off, free of charge, throughout the month of January.

**Middleton** - Town residents can drop off trees **January 2-3** and **January 6-10**, from **8:30am-4:30pm**, at the site on the west side of Brooklyn Rd. Call **902-825-4841** for details.

**Berwick** - Residents can drop off trees at the Public Works site during regular operating hours, or staff will pick them up from the roadside **during January**. For more info, call **902-538-8068**

**Kentville** - The Kinsmen Club will collect trees in Kentville on **Saturday, January 10**, for a freewill offering as a fundraiser for charity. For more details, call **902-678-6937**.

**Wolfville** - The Town will collect trees from **January 2-23**, and residents are welcome to set trees at the curb by Monday, **January 1**, at the earliest. Trees placed at the curb after January 23 will **NOT** be collected by the Town. For inquiries, call **902-542-5767 option 1**

You can also cut the tree in 4ft lengths, bundle it and set it out as brush for regular collection

Cardboard must be disposed of separately as it's banned from landfills. Improper disposal may incur penalties.



### DISPOSAL OF LITHIUM BATTERIES

Lithium batteries can cause fires in garbage trucks, and other waste facilities. **DO NOT** dispose of used or damaged batteries in garbage or recycling bags. Bring all batteries including non-removable ones to participating locations, or our sites for **FREE!**

#### HOW DO I GET RID OF COOKING FAT OR OIL?



Once solidified, fat can be composted. Liquid oil or grease should be placed in a cereal or cracker box and put in the green cart, lined with boxboard, flyers, or newspaper to avoid spills.

#### TEXTILES



Did you know that Textiles make up 18% of all items in Nova Scotia landfills. Consider donating all unwanted clothing footwear, towels, draperies, and clothing accessories to charity. If they are not useable, please put in **clear** garbage bags.

#### PRIVACY BAGS



Residents must use clear, transparent garbage bags for staff safety. \*One solid-colored bag is permitted for personal items per curbside collection, and both drivers and staff can inspect bags to ensure they contain only garbage. \*This bag counts toward the four-bag limit. **Some conditions may apply in rental units.**

### GREEN CART TIPS

#### KEEP YOUR CART CLEAN

To prevent pests and rodents, keep your cart clean by:

- Regularly hosing it out
- Wrapping food in cereal boxes or newspaper
- Refrigerating or freezing smelly items until collection
- Placing cat litter in paper or compostable bags



#### DON'T OVERFILL YOUR CART

The maximum capacity is 220 lb (100 kg). Carts over this weight cannot be lifted by the collection truck's hydraulics. Brush should be cut to fit in the cart or bundled for collection. Regularly empty your cart to prevent overload.



#### DON'T PUT ASHES IN YOUR CART:

Ashes should not be placed in the green cart as they can cause fires. They are safe for backyard compost but must be kept outside until cool. Dispose of ashes in a clear garbage bag, as they may contain metal or other materials.



#### DON'T LOCK US OUT!

Please ensure bungee cords and locks are removed before collection, as drivers are not responsible for replacing them on your cart.

#### WINTER COLLECTION

To prevent cart contents from freezing:

- Use balled-up paper or cooking spray to avoid sticking.
- Wrap food waste in paper to reduce moisture.
- Keep carts away from snow banks or icy areas, within 15 feet of the curb without blocking traffic.
- Put out carts for every collection to prevent frozen build-up.

#### RECYCLING BAG

Plastic clamshells can be put in your container blue bag.



#### GARBAGE

Wooden boxes have staples in them. They go in your clear garbage bag.



#### COMPOST

Paper containers are compostable.

Open burning of garbage releases several harmful pollutants. They make their way up the food chain to humans and potentially affect cell growth, the immune system, hormones and cancer development.

Allowable burning includes:

- brush
- tree limbs
- milled wood that is free from adhesives, coatings, and preservatives

Please check the Fire Restrictions at <https://novascotia.ca/burnsafe/> before burning brush.

Burn restrictions are updated daily at 2:00 pm, except when a provincewide burn ban is in place (you also need to follow municipal bylaws for your area). To report a wildfire or violations of the fire restrictions, call 1-800-565-2224 or 911.



Open burning of garbage is against the law in Nova Scotia, and could be subject to court action and/or a fine of \$812.50 (Nova Scotia Solid Waste-Resource Regulations)

## ILLEGAL DUMPING

You are responsible for the solid waste you generate. You must ensure the waste generated from your property is correctly sorted and properly disposed of.

- Illegal dumping is hazardous to humans, pets, wildlife and the environment. It is also unsightly and expensive to clean up.

**The cost to dispose of a small load (up to 80kg) at the Management Centres is \$10.**

**Anyone charged with burning or illegal dumping could face a fine of minimum \$500.00 and maximum of \$5,000.00**

### PIZZA BOXES

Go in your compost bin.



### FAST FOOD CONTAINERS & WRAPPINGS

Food, paper bags, napkins and cardboard containers go in compost bin.

Bottles can be recycled or put in refundables.



### TAKE-AWAY CUPS, ICE CREAM CONTAINERS

Clean takeaway cups and ice cream containers can now be recycled in your container blue bag.

Items must be at the curb by this time to ensure collection, as there is no specific arrival time for the collector.

Curbside Collection, takes place bi-weekly.

## CURBSIDE TRUCKS

As of April 1<sup>st</sup>, there will be two collection trucks, one for garbage and compost, and another for paper and container recycling.

## RESIDENTIAL BAG ALLOWANCES



You can have a **maximum of four clear\* bags for garbage**. One solid bag\* for personal items is allowed, but it counts toward the four-bag limit. **Ensure all bags are securely tied.** **\*Some conditions may apply in rental units.** **\*NEW\*** Unlimited recycling bags will be allowed per unit.

## BUSINESS BAG ALLOWANCES

The **combined total** of garbage and recycling bags including bundled cardboard **cannot exceed 8 bags**.

- Maximum of 4 clear garbage bags.
- Maximum of 6 bags of recyclables (which includes bundled cardboard).

Please ensure bags/bundles are securely tied.

## COMPOST BINS



The maximum cart capacity is 220 lb (100kg). Carts exceeding this weight can damage the hydraulics on the collection truck.

- Compost can be placed in empty boxboard containers (e.g., cereal boxes).
- Paper bags are acceptable for composting.
- Film 'compostable' bags can be used if marked with specific symbols.

## STORAGE OF WASTE



Curbside set-out of bags and compost bin must be no more than 5 metres from the curb. This also applies to storage bins. The bins must be accessible to the driver for waste collection. In the winter, please ensure that all bags and your compost bin is free from snow banks.

## NEVER MISS GARBAGE DAY

Download the Recycle Coach app for notifications on garbage days, collection changes, and clean-ups. It includes a "What Goes Where" tool for proper item sorting.

## LEAF BAGS AND GARDEN WASTE



Garden waste and leaves can go in your compost bin, but avoid overfilling. **Leaf bags aren't collected curbside;** instead, you can bring emptied bags of leaves

to our site for free. Excess garden waste will incur a tipping fee.

## BUNDLES OF CARDBOARD AND BRUSH

If your cardboard doesn't fit in the recycling bag, flatten it to 3ft x 2ft x 1ft and bundle.



You can set out up to two bundles on collection day.

Up to two bundles of brush may be set out for collection, with a maximum length of 4ft and width of 2ft.

Use standard blue and clear bags (max 39 inches flat) The maximum weight of 15kg.

# BULKY WASTE ITEMS

**\*Limit of two items per bi-weekly collection.**



### HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES

Such as a washer, dryer, or stove.

**NOTE:** Cooling devices such as fridges, freezers, air conditioners, water coolers, and dehumidifiers **must** be brought to our sites for CFC removal or display a certified CFC removal sticker.



### FURNITURE ITEMS

Such as a sofa, mattress, shelving. **Any one furniture or appliance item can weigh up to 91kg (200lb): other items must weigh no more than 34kg (75lb) each.** Carpet should be rolled in 4ft lengths.



### MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

Such as a water tank, boiler (which **must all be drained**).



### CONSTRUCTION WASTE

Lumber or loose items must be bagged or tied securely in bundles **no longer than 1.2 metres (4 ft).** Nails should be bent over or removed.



### SMALL AUTO PARTS

No fuel or fluids

**NEW!** As of April 1st, 2026, bulky waste will be collected on the same day as regular curbside collection on public roads. Residents on private roads should contact their cottage association for details.

## RULES FOR BULKY WASTE COLLECTION

- A maximum of 2 bulky items will be collected per stop, with each item defined as a single object or securely tied bundle up to 4ft in length.
- **Remove batteries from items;** they can be dropped off at participating locations or our sites for free. This includes items with encased batteries.
- Do **NOT** leave items at the end of your driveway that you do not want collected, or mark them clearly with a sign that says **Do Not Collect**.
- Residents must **remove any uncollected items from roadside after collection.**



## NOT ACCEPTED

## VERMICOMPOSTING

### 1. WORM BIN:

Use a shallow bin with holes for ventilation in the lid. Aim for 1 sq ft of space per pound of weekly food waste.



### 2. WORMS:

Red wigglers or European nightcrawlers are ideal. Start with about 1,000 worms (1 pound), which can process half a pound of food waste daily.

### 3. BEDDING:

Use moist, shredded newspaper, cardboard, or dead leaves. Fill the bin 2/3 full and add a bit of soil or compost.



### 4. FEED WORMS:

Add fruit and vegetable scraps, coffee grounds, and crushed eggshells. Avoid meat, dairy, citrus, and oily foods.



### 5. MAINTENANCE:

Keep the bin moist (like a damp sponge) and store in a cool, shady spot. Turn the bedding occasionally.



### 6. HARVESTING:

In 3-6 months, collect the worm castings for use in your garden by moving finished compost to one side and adding fresh bedding to the other. **Worm castings are a potent fertilizer, perfect for enriching soil in gardens and potted plants!**

## BACKYARD COMPOSTING

### 1. CHOOSE A COMPOST BIN OR PILE:

Use a prefabricated bin for tidiness or create a loose pile on the ground.



### 2. LOCATION:

Select a shady spot with good drainage, by your garden.



### 3. WHAT TO COMPOST:

- **Greens (Nitrogen-rich):** Vegetable scraps, fruit peels, coffee grounds.
- **Browns (Carbon-rich):** Dried leaves, straw, newspaper.
- Avoid meat, dairy, oils, pet waste, and treated materials.



### 4. LAYERING:

Start with coarse materials and alternate layers of greens and browns.



### 5. MOISTURE:

Keep compost damp, like a wrung-out sponge, and water if necessary.

### 6. TURNING:

Stir the compost every few weeks for to add oxygen.

### 7. PATIENCE:

Composting can take a few months to a year to yield dark, crumbly soil.

### 8. USING COMPOST:

Use finished compost to enrich soil or mulch around plants.

**Tips:** Chop larger items, cover scraps with browns, and enjoy reduced waste and improved soil health!

## VISITING OUR SITES

Valley Waste operates transfer stations in Kentville, and Lawrencetown. To ensure site safety, customers enter at their own risk and should ask a scale operator or site employee if unsure about item disposal.

### SECURE YOUR LOAD

Ensure load safety by following these guidelines:

- Use rope, netting, or straps to secure.
- Properly secure trailers.
- Attach large items directly to the vehicle or trailer.
- Cover loads with a sturdy tarp or netting.
- Avoid overloading.
- Double-check the load's security.



### PUBLIC DROP OFF

- Follow directional signs and speed limits.
- Use designated bins for waste.
- Avoid crawling into bins.
- Seek help from employees for misplaced items.
- Each section holds two vehicles; keep access clear.
- Only use the designated bin when it's in place.
- Children under 12 and pets must stay in vehicles.
- Scavenging and asking employees for items is prohibited.
- If unsure about item disposal, ask staff for help.



### WASTE DISPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

- Garbage must be in clear bags for staff safety.
- Mixed loads are allowed but must be sorted into the proper bins.
- Cardboard must be disposed of separately as it is banned from landfills.
- Improper loads may incur a penalty.

### CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION

- Unload only in designated areas.
- Do not dump on access roads.
- Secure loose items and clean tailgate/back bumper to prevent debris.



### VISITING OUR TIPPING FLOOR

- Do not cross the yellow staging line or back into the building without instruction.
- Do not enter the main building on foot.
- Follow the 20 km/h speed limit and obey all traffic signs.
- Valley Waste vehicles have the right of way.
- Enter the building at a walking pace with guidance.
- Customers must load/unload their own vehicles; ask for help at the scale house if needed.
- Valley Waste is not responsible for unloading damage.
- Stay near your vehicle on the tipping floor and leave promptly after unloading.



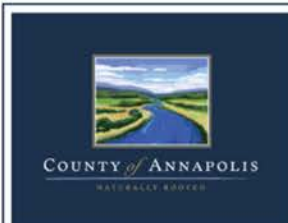

## BLUE BAG BLUNDERS COMMON MISTAKES



### MIXING PAPER AND RECYCLABLE CONTAINERS TOGETHER

Recycling must be sorted into two separate blue bags (Paper & Recyclable containers)

### MILK CARTONS IN THE WRONG BAG

Place empty milk cartons in the same bag as plastics, cans and jars.

### DIRTY RECYCLING

No need to be dishwasher clean. Just rinse food off the sides.

### CLOTHING

Textiles are not recyclable in the curbside program, however, there are MANY places you can take used clothing for donation.

### HARMFUL WASTE

Needles, diapers, batteries, and medical waste are a hazard to staff and should never go in the recycling.



Some waste items require special disposal or are part of provincial stewardship programs and cannot be collected curbside.

**CUTS LIKE A KNIFE**

Knives, scissors, saws, and many other sharp objects end up in bags, and compost bins. Check for knives before disposing of vegetable peelings. Sharp objects should be wrapped and labelled before putting them out for collection. **Keep our staff safe from harm.**

## GREEN CART Organics/ Compost



Wrap wet organics in paper or boxboard (like cereal boxes) to help keep your cart clean and prevent freezing.

**Maximum weight limit is 100 kg (220 lb)** to prevent equipment damage.

Dispose of leaves in the green cart or at Valley Waste (empty bags on-site).

Pine needles can go in the green cart or contact the Hotline for alternatives.

**NO plastics, diapers, personal wipes, disposable coffee cups or pods, and dog waste allowed!**

## BLUE BAG 1 Recyclable Containers



**Transparent blue bags required**



**Max 15kg (33lb)**

Use standard size bags no longer than 99cm (39in) when flat. No contractor bags

**Clean materials before placing them in blue bags.**

**Residential units ONLY** can set out unlimited sorted recycling bags

**ALL BAGS MUST BE SECURELY TIED**

### YARD WASTE

Up to two bundles of brush; maximum length 4ft and maximum width 2ft.



## BLUE BAG 2 Recyclable Paper



**Transparent blue bags required**



**Max 15kg (33lb)**

Use standard size bags no longer than 99cm (39in) when flat. No contractor bags

**Do not mix containers and paper in the same bag.**



Flatten and bundle cardboard boxes to a maximum size of 3ft x 2ft x 1ft, and place them next to blue bags. Residential units may place unlimited cardboard curbside.



**Residential units ONLY** can set out unlimited sorted recycling bags

## BULKY WASTE

**Limit of two items per bi-weekly collection**



Starting April 1, 2026, residents can place up to two bulky items curbside for biweekly collection.



Check clean-up regulations for accepted items. Private road residents should contact their road association or call the Hotline for their collection information.

## GARBAGE Clear Bags



**Limit of 4 bags of garbage per collection.**



**Max 15kg (33lb)**

Use standard size clear bags no longer than 99cm (39in) when flat. No contractor bags

**Each home can place 4 clear garbage bags\* at the curb.**

\*One solid coloured bag for personal items (garbage) is allowed within the 4-bag limit.

### PRIVATE ROADS

Residents on private roads should contact the Hotline or visit the website for set-out information.

### STORM CANCELLATIONS OR SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

Check social media, local radio, our website or Hotline.

### BUSINESS BAG ALLOWANCES

The total of garbage and recycling bags, including bundled cardboard, **cannot exceed 8 bags.**

- Maximum 4 clear garbage bags.
- Maximum 6 recyclable bags including bundled cardboard.

## GREEN CART Organics/ Compost

-  All food waste
-  Sugar and flour bags
-  Leaves, brush and plants
-  Coffee filters, tea bags (no coffee pods)
-  Soiled napkins/paper towels/facial tissues
-  Cat litter (preferably in paper or compostable bags)
-  Pizza boxes
-  Residential cooking fat or fat
-  Pine needles, pine cones, and tree nuts

- NO plastic bags. Only use bags labelled Certified Compostable 
- NO ashes (when cold put in clear garbage bag)
- NO plastics or milk cartons
- NO diapers, wipes or personal hygiene products
- NO disposable cups/coffee pods
- Bag powdery items if possible
- NO dog waste

**All refundable beverage containers or return to an Enviro Depot™**

## BLUE BAG 2 Recyclable Paper

-  Paper Envelopes not bubble mailers

**Do not mix container items and paper items in the same bag.**
